



RECYCLING COLLECTION REQUIREMENTS

1. Use of the Blue Polycart(s) for curbside collection is **optional**. Collection is twice monthly, done on Mondays.
2. Each resident will be given one (1) 95-gallon Polycart(s).
3. Additional units will carry an additional charge of \$5.18 + tax per unit/ per month.
4. The Polycart(s) will remain the property of the contractor which means that damaged or stolen Polycart(s) will be replaced at no charge to the resident.
5. To prevent any unnecessary leaks, spills, and garbage throughout the community; lids should remain closed at all time. Any materials that do not fit in the Polycart with a closed lid should be placed as bulk waste (at the curb, next to the Polycart) on the residents normal garbage collection day.
6. All 95-gallon Polycart(s) shall be placed at a single collection point within three (3) feet of the street curb.
7. Polycart(s) can be placed at the curb as early as 4:00PM the day before the scheduled collection, but no later than 7:00AM on the day of collection.
8. It is the responsibility of the resident to bring his/ or her Polycart(s) back into the yard within twenty-four (24) hours of being emptied.
9. ***Materials that may be recycled*** – Plastic Containers #1-5 & #7, Aluminum Containers, Steel Containers, Tin Containers, Glass, Newspaper, Wax Coated Paper Drink Containers, Broken Down Corrugated Cardboard & Boxboard, Mixed Paper. All items should be rinsed out before placing out for recycling.

Materials that may NOT be recycled – Paper Towels, Facial and Toilet Tissue, Plastic Bags & Packaging, Food & Wet Waste, Serving items (Paper, Plastic, and Styrofoam), Grass Clippings, Shredded Paper, Styrofoam.
10. It is the responsibility of the occupant of the property to keep the area around the garbage receptacles clean and in a sanitary condition and they must comply with City Staff's instructions.
