WHY FOG FOR MOSQUITOS?

Because they are annoying and bite! Plus, fogging for Mosquitos is a proactive measure against carrying West Nile virus, Encephalitis, Dengue, and Chikungunya. Regularly scheduled fogging reduces the probability of disease transmission by infected Mosquitos.

HOW CAN I PROTECT MY ANIMALS AND MYSELF?

- Help control Mosquitos by removing standing water in house gutters and debris.
- Do not allow water to stand too long or stagnate in birdbaths, pet bowls, flowerpots, wading pools, and other places where Mosquitos breed.
- Vaccinate your horses.

IS MOSOUITO FOGGING SAFE?

Research has shown that Mosquito Fogging poses no harm to humans or animals.

Research has also shown that, in areas with high rates of human disease, ULV (Ultra Low Volume) spraying reduces the rate of human infection immediately after application.

WEST HILE - HOW DOES IT SPREAD?

West Nile virus is spread by the bite of an infected Mosquito and can infect people, horses, many types of birds, and some other animals. There is no evidence that West Nile virus can be spread from person to person or from animal to person.
